

INTERNATIONAL MUSEUM DAY 2012

International Museum Day is celebrated every year to raise public awareness of the role museums play in the development of society. This year's event once again generated considerable enthusiasm around the world, with nearly 32,000 museums participating in 129 countries. ICOM wishes to thank the museums worldwide that publicised the event with creativity and passion.

ACTIVITIES ALL AROUND THE WORLD

The theme "Museums in a Changing World. New challenges, New inspirations" was interpreted in myriad ways by museums around the world and inspired numerous activities.

In Brazil, for example, the São Paulo Museum of Modern Art developed a programme combining art, technology and ecology in partnership with several local institutions.

In Zambia, the Livingstone Museum presented an exhibition entitled "Waste management in Livingstone - What are we doing about it?", with the assistance of local authorities, associations and private companies.

Meanwhile, the Communications Museum of Macao in China organised a two-day seminar open to professionals and the general public with several talks on topics related to museums in a changing world.

The National Museum of Montenegro in Cetinje, in collaboration with the University of Fine Arts, scheduled an outdoor interactive project where young artists were asked to comment on an art exhibition and then conceptualise a new way of presenting the works.
